Listen, sweetheart, said my mother while my father turned the key in the ignition, starting the engine, and with it, the radio. Nicole's song played through the speakers in the back shelf and door upholstery: Then I see the clouds above us, and hear the cry of the birds in the wind. ANDRZEJ SZCZYPIORSKI (1928—2000) was born in Warsaw, took part in the city's uprising against German occupation in 1944 and was subsequently sent to Sachsenhausen concentration camp. After the war, he worked as an author and publisher and became a member of the executive board of the Polish PEN Club and the Writer's Association. In December 1981, he was interned in a camp and remained a prisoner there until spring 1982. In 1989, he was chosen as a candidate by Solidarność and elected to the Polish Senate by the people. ## Beneath a bridge in Paris, in the frosty, dark January of 2024, a small miracle occurred.
